I wanted to share a little more information about Exam #1.

- After tomorrow's exam review in Webex, I will send out via email and post on the course website Exam #1, which will be due on Monday, 6/15 by 11:59pm. I'm giving it in advance to give you all a bit more time to work on it, so you can take your time and be careful with your work, instead of having to rush to complete it.
- You do **not** need to print Exam #1; you can just write your work and answers on paper. Be sure that I can clearly tell where the work is for each question and that your answers are clearly labeled.
- To submit your exam and the accompanying work, you can either scan it (if you have access to a scanner) or just take pictures with a mobile device. Please make sure that I can clearly read everything that you send.
- As mentioned in the syllabus, the work and thought process is required to receive full credit on the exam. An incorrect answer with supporting work can receive more credit than a correct answer without supporting work.
- You will be allowed to use notes on the exam, but you may **not** receive help from anyone else. I will provide more details about this when I send out the exam.
- To help you prepare for the exam, I have created an exam review in MyMathLab. You can find the exam review, which is called Exam #1 Review (Optional), in the Quizzes & Tests section in MyMathLab. This review is completely optional but it covers similar concepts, topics, and questions to what you'll find on the exam, so I hope you find this a helpful way to practice in preparation for the exam.
