

Hi everyone,

Attached is the Final Exam. I know you all are still working on Exam #3, but I wanted to provide this early so that you can start working on it as soon as you'd like after you complete Exam #3. As I mentioned in my email last Monday, the Final Exam will cover topics tested on the first three exams, so reviewing those exams will be helpful in preparing for the Final Exam. You have blank versions of those exams, so you can always retake each exam for practice. The answer keys for Exam #1 and Exam #2 are posted on the course website and I will post the answer key for Exam #3 on Tuesday, 7/21 in the morning, after Exam #3 is due, so you'll be able to check your answers if you choose to retake the exams for practice. I'm going to try to do my best to get your graded Exam #3 back to you all before the Final Exam is due, although I'm not sure if that will be possible. I recommend using the Exam #3 answer key when I post it as you prepare for the Final Exam.

As a reminder, we will have Final Exam reviews on Tuesday and Wednesday, 7/21 and 7/22. As with the other exam reviews, we will begin at 6:00pm and we will go until 8:20pm, which is the time our class is officially scheduled to end, or there are no more questions, whichever comes first. -- You may review the videos in MyMathLab or on the course website, use your notes, the textbook, the MyMathLab homework, quizzes, and/or the optional exam reviews for the previous exams, your previous exams and/or the answer keys for the previous exams, and your calculator when working on this exam. You may NOT receive help from anyone else, give help to anyone else, discuss any aspect of the exam or any items related to the exam with anyone else, or use any resources not specified in the previous sentence.

-- You may submit your answers and scratch work either on a printed copy of this exam or on your own paper. If you use your own paper, you do NOT need to copy the question; just be sure you clearly label which question the scratch work and answer belong to.

-- If I can't tell with certainty which question any scratch work or answer belongs to, you will not receive credit for that work or answer. If you use your own paper, you DO need to copy the honor code and sign it.

-- To submit your scratch work and answers, you can either scan your work (if you have access to a scanner) or take pictures with your cell phone, then email me your scans or pictures.

--Be sure the writing in your scans or pictures is dark enough that I can easily read what you've written. If I can't read what you've written, I can't give you credit for it.

-- Make sure your final answers are clearly labeled.
